Attendance

Across the past 2-3 years, we have seen a gradual decline in student attendance, with a dramatic rise in students with 20+ days of absence per year.

Following the success of our attendance incentives put in place in term 4 last year, the school will be implementing several strategies to reverse this trend. This will include:

- Weekly attendance award at school assembly
- Termly reward for students reaching attendance targets
- End of year celebration for outstanding school attendance

In addition, where your child's absence has not been entered on uEducateUs by 11am, parents will receive a notification. If you receive this message, please log onto the app to enter the reason for the absence.

There may be times when you receive this message incorrectly, as this system relies on teaching staff marking the role on time. We kindly ask for your patience as we all adjust to this new process.

Parents can also contact the office to register an absence.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club will be run each Tuesday and Thursday from 8:25am – 8:45am in the Art room. Students arriving at school prior to 8:45am must attend breakfast club. No new customers will be accepted after 8:45am.

Volunteers connected with our neighbouring church will host the Thursday morning sessions. Tuesdays session will be run by EPS staff.

Swimming Program

Swimming lessons will begin Monday 19th FEB. Running on Monday 19th, Tuesday 20th, Wednesday 21st and Thursday 22nd held at the Elmore Swimming Pool and run by Splash and Learn to Swim. Lessons will run - Prep, One Two class: 12:45pm - 1:30pm, Grade 3-6: 1:30pm - 2:15pm. Classroom teachers will walk with students to the pool, where they will then get changed into their bathers and apply sunscreen then begin their lessons. After the lesson students will change back into their school uniform and walk back to school with their teacher.

Each day students will need: ~Bathers

- ~Rashie We are a sun safe school, it is a requirement that all students participating in swimming lessons wear a rashie or t shirt to help protect them from the sun
- ~Towel
- ~Goggles (optional)
 ~A bag to carry bathers, towel
 and googles to the pool
 ~Extra snacks (students will eat
 before they head to the pool,
 and we will offer the opportunity
 to have another snack when
 they return. Pop an extra snack
 or 2 into the lunchbox, as
 swimming seems to increase
 everyone's appetite.
 Please clearly name all clothing

and towels – as you can imagine there are often items of clothing left unclaimed after each changing process. It makes for a smooth changing transition if all items (uniforms, bathers and towels) are named.
