OUR LEARNING FOCUS:

Literacy: In Reading, we have been exploring topics that interest us and issues that we are passionate about. Sharing a range of kid's news articles, nonfiction text and short stories. The students have enjoyed sharing their thoughts, opinions or interesting information they have found after reading. We have also shared war stories and looked at the significance of ANZAC Day the sacrifices the service men and women have made.

We have started our persuasive writing unit and the students have chosen topics that they are passionate about. The students have explored using persuasive techniques to convince the reader with their idea or opinion. They have chosen some great topics to write about:

Why duck hunting shouldn't be banned

Why too much time on technology is bad for you

Why animals shouldn't be kept in zoo's

Why life is hard as a kid

Why you shouldn't buy an electric vehicle

The benefits of gaming for kids


How bike riding can benefit your health

Stayed tunned to read some of these amazing pieces and see if they can persuade you!


Numeracy: We have been revisiting time by calculating elapsed time, reading timetables, converting 24hr time and looking at different time zones. The students have been working together to solve various time problems. In number, we have been exploring addition strategies and applying them to solve everyday life problems.

Inquiry: The students have started their unit on 'Our Island Home' where we have been exploring connection and our relationships with friends, family, school, community and other organisations.

Respectful Relationships: We have been practicing team building games establishing cooperation, problem solving and positive talk.

Vocabulary around heavy mass, light mass, equal mass will be talked about as well as activities using the balance scales and working with a partner. Tracey from the program visited the school last Friday morning. She had some great and relevant messages about dog body language and when we encounter a dog we don't know and what to do.


